The Board of Trustees of Mantua Township convened in special session from 6:30 to 7:00 p.m. in the Mantua Township Hall. Chairman Jason Carlton called the meeting to order with the following members and visitors present: John Festa, Victor Grimm, Trustees, Betsy Woolf, taking minutes for Marie Stehli, John Dickey, Zoning Inspector. Lynn Harvey and Roger Hurd, Zoning Commission members. Susan Skrovan, Zoning Commission Secretary, Gary & Jane Carlton, Applicants and Stacey Turner from the Weekly Villager.

Jason Carlton swore in the audience members. Jason will abstain from voting due to being related to the applicant, but will converse. There was a discussion on the proposed amendment to the Zoning Book. John Festa stated he didn't receive correspondence from zoning on a recommendation. Lynn Harvey advised she place letters in the trustees packets. Section 700 is landscaping, fencing & screening. The minimum of 5 acres has been removed from the proposal and replaced with a minimum of 10 acres, not to exceed 15 acres. This will have to go before the BZA. Lynn Harvey stated that Chad Murdock is supposed to be here and had all the changes and verbage. Carltons were not notified that Chad would not attend the meeting. As far as Lynn, knew Chad would be here.
